INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding resolutions to be proposed at the forthcoming AGM to be held at Unit A, 8th Floor, D2 Place Two, 15 Cheung Shun Street, Cheung Sha Wan, Kowloon, Hong Kong on Friday, 16 October 2020 at 4:00 p.m. to (a) grant to the Directors general mandates to repurchase and issue Shares of the Company; and (b) to re-elect the retiring Directors.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

GENERAL MANDATE AND REPURCHASE MANDATE

The General Mandate and the Repurchase Mandate shall be effective until whichever is the earliest of:

- (a) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; or
- (b) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Bye-laws or any applicable laws of Bermuda to be held; or
- (c) the passing of an ordinary resolution by the Shareholders in general meeting revoking or varying the authority given to the Directors.

Under the GEM Listing Rules, the Company is required to give to the Shareholders all information which is reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision as to whether to vote for or against the resolution to renew the grant to the Directors of the Repurchase Mandate. The explanatory statement required by the GEM Listing Rules to be included in this circular is set out in Appendix I.

GENERAL MANDATE

The Company has in issue an aggregate of 240,359,354 Shares as at the Latest Practicable Date. Subject to the passing of the proposed resolution for the approval of the General Mandate and in accordance with the terms therein, the Company would be allowed to allot and issue up to a maximum of 48,071,870 Shares, representing 20% of the total number of issued Shares at the time of the passing of the resolution approving the General Mandate on the basis that no further Shares will be issued or repurchased by the Company prior to the AGM. In addition, it is further proposed, by way of a separate ordinary resolution that the General Mandate be extended so that the Directors be given a general mandate to issue further Shares repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate. Any issue of new Shares of the Company is subject to approval from the Stock Exchange for the listing of and permission to deal in such new Shares.

The Directors have no present intention to allot and issue new Shares under the General Mandate.

REPURCHASE MANDATE

At the AGM, an ordinary resolution will also be proposed that the Directors be granted a general and unconditional mandate to exercise all powers of the Company to repurchase Shares up to a maximum of 24,035,935 Shares, representing 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing of the relevant resolution.

In addition, if the resolution to authorize the repurchase of shares is passed, an ordinary resolution will be proposed at the AGM providing that any Shares repurchased (up to a maximum of 10% of the issued Shares as at the date of the grant to the Repurchase Mandate) will be added to the total number of Shares which may be allotted and issued under the General Mandate.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

An explanatory statement required by the GEM Listing Rules to be sent to the Shareholders in connection with the proposed general mandate to repurchase the Company's shares is set out in Appendix I to this circular. The explanatory statement contains all information reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the relevant resolutions at the AGM.

PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

Pursuant to Bye-laws 99, Mr. Law Ka Kei, Ms. Siu Yeuk Hung Clara will retire as executive Directors and Mr. Ho Tak Yin will retire as independent non-executive Director respectively at the AGM and being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election to the respective office.

To enable Shareholders to make an informed decision on the re-election of these retiring Directors and independent non-executive Director, the biographical details of each of the retiring Directors and independent non-executive Director, as required under Chapter 17 of the GEM Listing Rules, are set out in Appendix II to this circular for information of the Shareholders.

RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT

This circular, for which the Directors collectively and individually accept full responsibility, includes particulars given in compliance with the GEM Listing Rules of the Stock Exchange for the purpose of giving information with regard to the Company. The Directors, having made all reasonable enquiries, confirm that to the best of their knowledge and belief the information contained in this circular is accurate and complete in all material respects and not misleading or deceptive, and there are no other matters the omission of which would make any statement herein or this circular misleading.

ACTION TO BE TAKEN

Notice of the AGM is set out on pages 14 to 17 to this circular. A proxy form for appointing proxy is despatched with this circular and published on the GEM website (www.hkgem.com) and the Company's website (www.ecrepay.com). Whether or not you intend to attend the AGM, you are requested to complete the proxy form and return it to the Company's Branch Registrar, Tricor Standard Limited at Level 54, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Hong Kong not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for the holding of the AGM or the adjourned meeting. Completion and return of a proxy form will not preclude you from attending and voting at the meeting and any adjourned meeting if you so wish.

Pursuant to Rule 17.47(4) of the GEM Listing Rules, any vote of shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll. Therefore, all resolutions proposed at the AGM shall be voted by poll.

CLOSURE OF REGISTER OF MEMBERS

For determining the entitlement to attend and vote at the AGM, the register of members of the Company will be closed from Tuesday, 13 October 2020 to Friday, 16 October 2020, both dates inclusive, during which period no transfer of Shares will be registered. In order to be eligible to attend and vote at the AGM, unregistered holders of Shares shall ensure that all transfer documents accompanied by the relevant share certificates must be lodged with the Company's branch share registrar and transfer office in Hong Kong, Tricor Standard Limited, at Level 54, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Hong Kong for registration not later than 4:30 p.m. on Monday, 12 October 2020.

RECOMMENDATION

The Directors consider that the granting of the General Mandate and Repurchase Mandate to the Directors to issue shares and to repurchase shares of the Company and re-election of the retiring Directors are in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders. The Directors therefore recommend the Shareholders to vote in favour of the relevant resolutions as set out in the notice of the AGM.

This is an explanatory statement given to all Shareholders of the Company relating to the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM authorising the Repurchase Mandate. It contains all the relevant information required pursuant to Rule 13.08 of the GEM Listing Rules which is set out as follows:

1. SHARE CAPITAL

On 8 September 2020, being the Latest Practicable Date, prior to the printing of this circular, there was a total of 240,359,354 Shares in issue.

Subject to the passing of the resolution granting the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased before the AGM, the Company will be allowed to repurchase a maximum of 24,035,935 Shares, representing 10% of the total number of issued shares of the Company as at the date of the AGM.

2. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders to seek a general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Company to repurchase its Shares on the GEM. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value and/or earnings per share of the Company and will only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and the Shareholders.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Repurchases made pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate would be funded out of funds legally available for the purpose in accordance with the Company's Bye-laws, the GEM Listing Rules and the applicable laws of Bermuda.

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited accounts contained in the Annual Report for the year ended 31 March 2020) in the event that the Repurchase Mandate were to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse impact on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels of the Company.

5. THE TAKEOVERS CODE AND MINIMUM PUBLIC HOLDING

If, as a result of a repurchase of the Share pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder, or a group of Shareholders acting in concert, depending on the level of increase of the Shareholders' interest, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the following persons were interested in 5% or more of the issued share capital of the Company. In the event that the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full and there is no change in the number of Shares held by them after the Repurchase Mandate is exercised, the interest of such persons will be increased to approximately the percentage set out in the last column as follows:

Note 1: 1,620,000 Shares held by Mr. Shiu Yeuk Yuen (“**Mr. Shiu**”) in person, 7 Shares held by Mr. Shiu’s spouse and 82,288,613 Shares are held by Able Rich Consultants Limited (“**Able Rich**”), a wholly-owned subsidiary of Rich Treasure Group Limited (“**Rich Treasure**”), of which Mr. Shiu is the sole director and shareholder of those company.

Note 2: Bai Yu is an independent third party.

In the opinion of the Directors, if the Repurchase Mandate were exercised in full, the above shareholder would be obliged to make a mandatory offer to shareholder under Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeover Code. The Directors have no intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent that will result to make a mandatory offer under the Takeovers Code. The Directors have also no intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent that will result in the number of shares of the Company in the hands of public falling below the prescribed minimum percentage of 25%.

The Directors are currently not aware of any consequences which will arise under the Takeovers Code as a result of any purchase made under the Repurchase Mandate.

6. SHARE REPURCHASE MADE BY THE COMPANY

The Company had not purchased any of the Shares (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise) in the six months immediately preceding the Latest Practicable Date.

7. DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTS AND UNDERTAKING OF THE DIRECTORS

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their close associates have any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company, if the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that they will only exercise the power of the Company to make repurchase pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the GEM Listing Rules, the Bye-laws and the applicable laws of Bermuda.

The Company has not been notified by any core connected person (as defined in the GEM Listing Rules) that such a person has a present intention to sell any Shares to the Company nor has any such core connected person undertaken not to sell any Shares to the Company in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders to the Board.

The following Directors are proposed to be re-elected at the AGM:

1. Ms. Siu Yeuk Hung, Clara, *Executive Director*

Ms. Siu Yeuk Hung, Clara (“**Ms. Siu**”), aged 55, joined the Company on 9 August 2017 and being a director of all subsidiaries of the Company. Ms. Siu has extensive experience in marketing and business development. Prior to joining the Company, Ms. Siu has worked in a company listed on The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited, responsible for the marketing and business development since 2006. Ms. Siu is the sister of Ms. Siu York Chee, the director of several subsidiaries of the Company. Ms. Siu also is the sister of Mr. Shiu Yeuk Yuen, who is the substantial shareholder of the Company. Ms. Siu has been appointed as the chairman of the Company with effect from 2 July 2020.

Save as disclosed, Ms. Siu also does not hold any other positions with the Company and other members of the Company’s group and she does not have any relationship with any Directors, senior management or substantial shareholders or controlling shareholders (as defined in the Rules Governing the Listing of Securities on the GEM of the Stock Exchange (“**GEM Listing Rules**”)) of the Company.

Ms. Siu has not held any directorships in any other public companies in the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the past three years.

Ms. Siu does not hold any interest, short position in any shares or underlying shares in or any debentures of the Company or any of its associated corporation within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance (Chapter 571 of the Laws of Hong Kong) Kong).

Ms. Siu has entered into a service contract with the Company and the service contract shall be renewed automatically after a year unless and until terminated by not less than three months’ notice in writing served by either party on the other and also subject to retirement by rotation and re-election in accordance with the articles of association of the Company.

Ms. Siu is entitled to a monthly remuneration of HK\$61,750 and a discretionary bonus as determined by the remuneration committee of the Company with reference to her duties and performance and the operating results of the Company. The remuneration of Ms. Siu was fixed with reference to her duties and responsibilities with the Company as well as the Company’s remuneration policy. There is no other matters which need to be brought to the attention of the Company’s shareholders.

2. Mr. Law Ka Kei, Executive Director

Mr. Law Ka Kei (“**Mr. Law**”), aged 44, currently is a director of two subsidiaries of the Company. Mr. Law joined the Group as the General Manager of People’s Market in 2012. Mr. Law has over 18 years’ retail chain management experience. Mr. Law obtained a Degree of Business Administration from Lingnan University, Hong Kong.

Mr. Law (i) was not connected and has no relationship with any existing or proposed directors, senior management, substantial shareholders, or controlling shareholders of the Company; and (ii) did not hold any directorship in the last three years in public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas.

Mr. Law is interested in 2,185,000 shares of the Company, representing approximately 0.91% of the total issued share capital of the Company. Save as disclosed herein, Mr. Law does not hold any short position in any shares or underlying shares in or any debentures of the Company or any of its associated corporation within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance (Chapter 571 of the Laws of Hong Kong) Kong).

Mr. Law has entered into a service contract with the Company and the service contract shall be renewed automatically after a year unless and until terminated by not less than three months’ notice in writing served by either party on the other and also subject to retirement by rotation and re-election in accordance with the articles of association of the Company.

Mr. Law is entitled to receive a director’s fee of HK\$43,000 per month which is determined by the Board by reference to the duties and responsibilities undertaken by him as a director of the Company. In accordance with the bye-laws of the Company, he will hold office until the first general meeting of the Company and will then be eligible for re-election; thereafter he will be subject to retirement by rotation at least once every three years at the annual general meetings of the Company since his last re-election.

3. Mr. Ho Tak Yin, Independent Non-executive Director

Mr. Ho Tak Yin (“**Mr. Ho**”), aged 49, is a director of a design company since 2002. Mr. Ho has over 18 years of experience in design industry and has sufficient experience in company operational management. Mr. Ho obtained a Degree of Arts in Graphic Design from University of Lincolnshire & Humberside, UK.

Mr. Ho (i) does not hold any positions with the Company or other members of the Group; (ii) has not entered into any service contract with the Company or other members of the Group; (iii) was not connected and has no relationship with any existing or proposed directors, senior management, substantial shareholders, or controlling shareholders of the Company; and (iv) is not interested in and does not hold any short position in any shares or underlying shares in or any debentures of the Company or any of its associated corporation within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance (Chapter 571 of the Laws of Hong Kong) and (v) did not hold any directorship in the last three years in public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas.

Mr. Ho has entered into a service contract with the Company and the service contract shall be renewed automatically after a year unless and until terminated by not less than three months’ notice in writing served by either party on the other and also subject to retirement by rotation and re-election in accordance with the articles of association of the Company.

Mr. Ho is entitled to receive a director’s fee of HK\$100,000 per annum which is determined by the Board by reference to the duties and responsibilities undertaken by him as a director of the Company. In accordance with the bye-laws of the Company, he will hold office until the first general meeting of the Company and will then be eligible for re-election; thereafter he will be subject to retirement by rotation at least once every three years at the annual general meetings of the Company since his last re-election.

Save as disclosed above, the Company is not aware of any other matters in relation to Ms. Siu, Mr. Law and Mr. Ho that are required to be disclosed pursuant to the GEM Listing Rules 17.50(2)(h) to rule 17.50(2)(v) or any matters that need to be brought to the attention of the holders of securities of the Company in relation to re-election of Ms. Siu and Mr. Law as executive Directors and Mr. Ho as independent non-executive Director.
